HOW WOULD YOU HAVE REACTED?

Most Bible students will correctly associate the name Matthias with the man who was selected to take the place of Judas after the betrayer committed suicide. The Bible says, "And they gave forth their lots; and the lot fell upon Matthias: and he was numbered with the eleven apostles" (Acts 1:26).

But what about Barsabas, the other potential apostle? The disciples "appointed two, Joseph called Barsabas, who was surnamed Justus, and Matthias" (Acts 1:23). Both met the stated qualifications for apostleship. But only one replacement was needed, consequently they prayed that God would make known His selection (Acts 12:24-25). God chose Matthias.

Actually we're not told what happened to Joseph, or even what his attitude toward the selection of Matthias over him was. If it was like some today, perhaps he would have quit the church, or at least begun worshipping with some other congregation! Their attitude would have been "all or nothing." If they could not be an apostle, they wouldn't be anything. Or, if they did not quit the church, they would have hovered around Matthias like buzzards, waiting for him to make his first inevitable mistake, then pounced on him to vindicate themselves.

But I hope Joseph had a better attitude than that. I hope the years with Jesus had ennobled him and cleansed him of worldly faults, and instead of bitterness he would rejoice in the honoring of his brother. Instead of resentment, I hope he humbly accepted the Lord's infinite wisdom. I hope he went right on faithfully living to serve Christ in whatever capacity he might later fulfill, and rejoiced in the Lord's love.

But what about us? How would we have reacted? Our best way of knowing is by examining how we are alreday reacting to our present station in life, whatever it may be. The only honor that really matters is hearing the "Well done, good and faithful servant" announced by the Lord.
