## An Old Man's Prayer, by Mike Benson

As I have entered my senior years, it is inevitable that as I look back on my life, I have some regrets or at best, some things that I would do better given my knowledge and experience. My prayer might be as follows:

#### Dear Lord,

I praise your name and your glory and honor. I thank you for creation, but especially the gift of Your Son, and everything He means to us. I thank you for your grace and mercy. Especially I want to ask your forgiveness:

- For massive amounts of time that I wasted on worldly pursuits that seemed so important at the time, but now I can see were diversions from things that should have been more important to me. (Colossians 3:1-2)
